Background: This is a one-year clinical fellowship to provide advanced knowledge and skills in endocrine surgery beyond the training available during residency. This Head and Neck surgical experience involves exposure to general surgical and head and neck surgical attending surgeons. Emphasis on fiberoptic laryngeal exam, RLN neural monitoring techniques, thyroid cancer and nodal surgery. This training focuses on scholarship, critical analysis of clinical problems, and the development of added skills required for this subspecialty, including the development of complex endocrine surgical skills, multi-disciplinary treatment planning, and experience in basic and clinical research methodologies and is intended for surgeons desiring an academic career. The fellow will be exposed to approximately 250 endocrine (thyroid and parathyroid) surgical cases performed at Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary and Massachusetts General Hospital during the year of his/her fellowship. It is of note that the total case load for two of the fellowship senior attendings includes approximately 500 thyroidectomies, 150 parathyroidectomies, 70 neck dissections, and 15 associated airway cases per year.

Surgeons: 2 senior, two junior

Funding: Fellowship funds can be provided, or the fellow can provide funding.

Requirements: Completion of a part of a general or otolaryngology surgical training residency program. Applications (cv + 3 letters of recommendation, with one letter from the program chair) are accepted until October 1 of the year prior to the July 1 start date. Applicants must have taken and passed USMLE and ECFMG.
