

Dr Inne Borel-Rinkes

Dr Inne Borel-Rinkes trained in Rotterdam after having finished medical school in Leiden University. His surgical training was interrupted for a two-year surgical research fellowship at Mass General Hospital and Shriners Burns Center, Harvard Medical School in Boston, MA (Ronald G Tompkins and Martin L Yarmush). This resulted in a PhD on hepatocytes in liver support systems. Specialization in surgical oncology in Rotterdam. Since 1995, he has been staff surgeon in University Medical Center in Utrecht. Dr Borel-Rinkes was appointed Professor of Surgery in 2002. He has been for twelve years the program director for surgical training and for fifteen years, the Head of the Dept. of Surgical oncology, Endocrine and GI surgery. Surgical focus on Endocrine and HPB surgery, including minimally invasive approaches. Besides (para)thyroid and adrenal surgery, endocrine surgical activities include the treatment of pancreatic NETs and metastatic disease. He has supervised 72 PhD graduates and (co)authored over 400 publications. Dr Borel Rinkes has also served on several expeditions and teaching activities in low- and middle income countries.

Member of IAES council since 2020, ex-officio since last year to chair INTEREST, IAES's educational outreach program for endocrine surgery in areas where endocrine surgery is underdeveloped.
