

Fausto Palazzo

Professor Fausto Palazzo was appointed to the Hammersmith Hospital department of endocrine surgery in 2005 and since 2006 has been clinical lead for what is now the UK's largest department of endocrine surgery. He has been a fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England since 1997 and developed a specialist interest in endocrine surgery after two years as an endocrine surgical research fellow at St Bartholomew's Hospital, London for which he was awarded a Master of Surgery by the University of London. He trained in clinical endocrine surgery in Oxford, Sydney Australia (T.S Reeve Fellow 2003-4) and Marseille France (BAES travelling Fellow 2004-5). He became an Intercollegiate Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons (endocrine sub-speciality) in 2003.

Fausto Palazzo has previously been on the executive of the BAETS for over 8 years, is the UK delegate to the ESES and has been a national advisor on parathyroid surgery and adrenal surgical commissioning. He has published widely on all aspects endocrine surgery and teaches undergraduates and post graduates at Imperial College. He was conferred the title of professor at Imperial College in 2019.
