FELLOWSHIP AIMS	To train surgeons who are likely to be future leaders in academic endocrine surgery. To provide an extensive experience in the diagnostic and operative management of patients with common and rare endocrine surgical conditions. To promote clinical and basic science research in the field of surgical endocrinology and oncology.
FELLOWSHIP DESCRIPTION & CURRICULUM	The University of Sydney Endocrine Surgical Unit has an annual caseload of over 1500 endocrine surgical cases. These include 300 new thyroid cancer presentations, 400 parathyroid procedures, 45 adrenalectomy procedures and 10 neuroendocrine cases per year. Fellows will receive a comprehensive exposure to operative surgery both as an independent operator and assistant, and will coordinate the endocrine surgical service at Royal North Shore Hospital. Multidisciplinary outpatient clinics are run weekly with an exposure to point of care ultrasound and fibre-optic laryngoscopy. A weekly endocrine surgical seminar program aims to fulfil the learning objectives as set out by the Australian Association of Endocrine Surgeons and American Association of Endocrine Surgeons.
ELIGIBILITY	Candidates should have completed training in General Surgery and be able to participate on an Acute General Surgical Emergency Roster. Please provide an updated CV and 2 letters of recommendation. Applications for the TS Reeve Fellowship are NOT part of the AAES match. Candidates will be notified of outcomes prior to the AAES match taking place. Applications are due by the 1 <sup>st</sup> of May yearly and the successful candidate will be expected to commence the Fellowship in July of the following year.
